King's College School, Wimbledon is an independent day school. Founded in 1829 by royal charter, it is a school of over 1,400 students and is one of the most academically successful schools in the world. King's Wimbledon is consistently among the very top schools in national league tables.

Outstanding results

Over 300 boys and girls have won places at Oxford or Cambridge in the last six years, with over 90% of students achieving their first-choice university offer. In 2019, 50% of all Sixth Form grades were A* at A level or 7 at IB Higher Level and 83% of all GCSEs were graded A* or 9/8.






WHAT SETS KING'S APART?

King's develops well-rounded, confident and happy boys and girls who will make a positive difference to their communities. We do this through placing equal weight on:

- A strong academic curriculum developed with the King's Wimbledon team. The King's curriculum has a proven track record of producing academic excellence as well as creative alumni who go on to have success in a wide range of fields: from famous musicians and actors to high court judges, software developers, writers, surgeons and academics.
- A pastoral system which gives children the support and guidance to become calm, happy adults. The tutor and house systems work to give children a sense of community and purpose so that they enjoy coming to school and have a network of people to go to in times of need.

Happy children in a kind school learn more

At King's Bangkok, we aim to offer stimulating and challenging lessons from passionate and well-qualified teachers. From the Early Years upwards, we want to develop every child's intellectual curiosity and eventually help them achieve outstanding examination results so that they can attend the best universities worldwide. This requires more than a world-class academic curriculum; children need to feel happy in school and have strong moral values to direct them along the right path in life. We aim to provide them with a wide range of co-curricular activities to help them become confident, empathetic, resilient and versatile adults. Our children will achieve much more than academic success.

Teachers

All of our Form Tutors have gone through an extensive recruitment process that culminated in an interview with a Senior Leader at King's College School, Wimbledon. Not only does this make us confident that we have found the best teachers, it also gives parents the peace of mind that we have the same quality of students as our partnership schools.

Spaces to play in clean air

We have invested in spaces for our students to play both outside and inside. Outside, we have tennis courts, FIFA-endorsed astroturf and huge playspaces for both the Pre-prep and the Junior School children. Inside, we have many air-conditioned spaces, including one level of multipurpose space, a Dance Studio and the Sports Hall. All air-conditioning units are equipped with MERV 13 air filters which purify the outdoor air and reduce PM2.5 to the occupied space.

PRF-PRFPARATORY SCHOOL

Early Years and Key Stage I education is such an exciting time in our children's journey, as it provides the necessary building blocks for later in life. It is also when we see the biggest changes and developments in children. A good start to education has big effects on young people and we do not take this responsibility lightly.

World-class facilities

Our children begin in the Early Years Centre in year groups of Pre-nursery, Nursery and Reception. These students have their own facilities in a safe, friendly and stimulating environment, including extensive outdoor areas where they can learn through play.

The transition to Key Stage 1

In Year I and Year 2, students move out of the Early Years Centre to join the older students. They benefit from large specialist classrooms and more Specialist Teachers while keeping the structure and support of a Class Teacher. They also have their own inside and outside play and learning areas.

Outstanding teaching staff

All students are taught by at least one fully qualified and experienced international teacher and every class has an Assistant Teacher who is adept at speaking both Thai and English, to help students who are learning English as an additional language. The Early Years classes are also supported by a team of Nannies to help ensure that children are cared for throughout the day.

A curriculum underpinned with our values

Whichever part of the Pre-prep they are in, children study an exciting and challenging curriculum that develops individual abilities and fosters independence, curiosity, problem-solving skills and creativity. We also ensure that all students become respectful, tolerant, kind and caring individuals who are sensitive to the needs of others. These values run throughout our school.

A curriculum from one of the most academically successful schools in the world

In all year groups, King's Wimbledon and King's Bangkok broadly follow the national curriculum of England and Wales. The King's Bangkok curriculum has been adapted to suit the environment we live in and the needs of the students we have. Our curriculum has been approved by King's College School, Wimbledon.

Early Years Centre

In their very first years of education, the children will experience a curriculum that is designed to give them plenty of opportunities to develop, have fun and be challenged both in and outside of the classrooms. Giving children this education requires outstanding teaching staff and world-class facilities.

According to the UK government, "a child's experiences between birth and age five have a major impact on their future life chances. A secure, safe and happy childhood is important in its own right." Therefore, our Early Years Centre combines educational research, decades of teaching experience and innovative modern designs to fully prepare our children for their education further up the school.

The designs are centred around providing spacious and fully equipped classrooms (of no less than 64 square metres) which give students space to explore. In addition, we have developed rich and varied outdoor spaces to ensure that our students spend time in a variety of learning environments and develop all of the skills they need to help them achieve later on in their school life and beyond. We have a large playground, sandpit, opportunities to climb, bicycle tracks, a Cooking Room, an Early Years swimming pool and splash area and a section of the main library. This gives us the tools to offer a truly world-class education which will ensure that every student is ready for the next key stage of their learning.









Pre-nursery and nursery

A child-centred curriculum

We deliver a curriculum based on a child-centred, play-based approach, meeting individual needs across all areas of learning and development. We base our teaching on the Early Years Foundation Stage of the English national curriculum, as this is world renowned for providing an excellent base for young people.

Learning through play

A great deal of teaching is through child-initiated activities both inside and outside the classroom. Teachers help children develop by being involved in the children's play in addition to individual and group activities. By allowing students to choose, problem-solve and work together, we foster initiative, creativity, confidence and the ability to negotiate, all of which are skills necessary for success later in life.



One Class Teacher

We believe that children do their best when they have one teacher and one Assistant Teacher who sees them for the majority of their lessons in school. These teachers know each child's strengths and weaknesses. They can support and challenge regardless of the subject they are enjoying. However, we also want our students to receive specialist teaching in Music, swimming and Thai language and culture to give them greater depth in these specialist areas.

A schedule designed to help students grow

In Pre-nursery and the first term of Nursery, we believe that children can only learn effectively for half a day. Our days are fun, exciting and packed full of learning and children find this tiring.

In the second and third terms of Nursery, we extend the day to a full day but we build in a rest time for children to nap, rest or play quietly in the afternoon.

This helps students to develop without rushing them. Our students will love their time with us but will also associate school with learning.

Reception

World-class curriculum

In Reception, our curriculum follows the same philosophy, but becomes more academic as we teach the children the more formal skills of reading and writing. We base our teaching on the Early Years Foundation Stage of the English national curriculum, but we encourage all our teachers to be adventurous in going beyond the curriculum and bringing the very best out of every child.

High expectations

We have high expectations of our children but also celebrate individuality and want our children to show character and be proud of who they are. Developing the whole person, spiritually, socially, physically and morally is extremely important to us and values and manners are a vital part of our education.

ECAs

In Reception, children are given opportunities to take ECAs (optional activities) after academic lessons finish to broaden their experiences.

Key Stage I (Years I-2)

Our approach

We draw from the work of King's College School, Wimbledon in delivering an excellent curriculum underlined by strong values, in addition to teaching Thai Studies, outdoor learning and Mandarin.

Supporting the transition from Early Years

Key Stage I is the transition between the Early Years and the junior section of the school. Our expectations become more academic but our philosophy does not change and we continue to provide the children with a friendly environment where everyone is challenged to improve. We still have a learning focus, which encourages children to think, be creative and develop problem-solving skills.

Learning-centred approach

We provide a rich and diverse range of learning opportunities to stimulate, challenge and support each student's learning at a level appropriate to their ability. Lessons are more subject-based through mini topics, with numeracy and literacy lessons taught daily. Mandarin, Sport and Music Teachers extend our children's interests and skills.

ECAs

Our students are also given opportunities to take part in clubs and societies during lunchtimes as well as CCAs and ECAs in the afternoons.

JUNIOR SCHOOL (Years 3-6)

Developing lifelong learners

We believe that this is an age group where the flame of learning still burns brightly and we wish to build on this enthusiasm, as there is a risk it can diminish at this age. Students are fascinated by the world around them, but they need challenges and guidance by outstanding teachers to continue to excel and develop.

Curriculum for excellence

With a truly international cohort, we place literacy and language development at the centre of our curriculum in the Junior School, as this allows access to and success in every other subject. Around this, we develop the highest levels in all other areas of the curriculum to stretch and challenge our students so that they are ready for the Senior School. We teach, through an enquiry-based approach where possible, to develop skills that students need for later in life

Connected learning

Connected learning is intended to develop students' interests and take their learning and skills to a higher level through enquiry-based learning in a topic or subject they are interested in. Students research and carry out projects on a subject or topic of their choice either independently, in pairs or in small groups.

Co-curricular programme

To contribute to the students' enjoyment of school we have a broad and varied range of co-curricular activities for them to be excited about each day. These run at lunchtimes (clubs and societies), are compulsory and built into the school day (CCAs) or are optional activities after school (ECAs).

SENIOR SCHOOL (Years 7–13)

What makes a school outstanding? Teachers who love working with students, love their subject and love teaching it. The best possible pastoral care that makes every student feel they are as important to the school as it is to them. A whole world of sports, music, drama and activities beyond the classroom with first-rate facilities. A body of students who care as much about the successes and happiness of their friends as their own.

We are a forward-thinking and innovative place in which to learn. We offer students the opportunity to study from a wide curriculum that leads to IGCSEs and A levels before they move on to universities around the world.

Academic

The quality of teaching at King's Bangkok is outstanding and colleagues know how important it is in the Senior School to continue establishing a love of learning, good habits of concentration, understanding, imaginative flexibility and discipline. Lessons are fun, exhilarating and purposeful, creating the best possible foundation for a lifetime of open-mindedness, learning and creativity.

Students are taught by Specialist Teachers in English Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Geography History, Art, Design Technology, Drama, Music, Computing PSHE, swimming and PE. All students will study two languages as well as English. Thai students will study GCSEThai (which is also an option for non-Thai students if they choose it).

Pastoral

Our pastoral support is exceptional. The students are placed in forms, allowing them to build long-lasting friendships with each other. Students meet with their Form Tutor every day, who ensures that they are looked after and encouraged to make the best of the numerous opportunities on offer.

Twice a week, students meet in their 'tutor groups' which comprise students in Years 7–9 or students in Years 10–13 led by their House Tutor. This allows students to make friends across year groups and experience peer mentoring, where the older students can take on leadership and share knowledge to their younger peers. In addition the House Tutor is on hand to provide parents with guidance on all aspects of school life. Should we feel a student is not happy or not making the academic progress expected, the House Tutor will be the first person to invite parents in to discuss the best way forward.

As well as helping each student fulfil his academic potential, we want to see him or her develop in many other ways too. For this reason, students join a senior house as soon as they enter the Senior School. House events, Games, the arts, clubs and visits all combine to form an exciting experience and help students quickly get to know each other and care about each other's wellbeing.

SENIOR SCHOOL (Years 7–13)

Academic

Sixth Form students study A levels, an internationally recognised qualification which prepares them for any university around the world. For A levels, students pursue three or four courses in the Lower Sixth and sit A level exams in three or four subjects at the end of the Upper Sixth.

Careers and universities

Careers guidance begins in Year 9 and we work closely with King's Wimbledon to ensure that we provide our students with the best possible help and support. Parents and students are given a broad range of information so that they can make the best choices moving forward. Part of this is advising students on GCSE and A level choices as well as helping them to prepare university applications. We focus on helping students to find a course and university that they will enjoy and succeed in rather than forcing them to apply to set universities or to specific courses.

Years 10-11 curriculum

Our students will study 8–11 GCSEs or IGCSEs which they will sit at the end of Year 11. All students will take a core set of GCSEs: Mathematics, English, Biology, Chemistry, and Physics. They are then able to choose options from a list which is likely to include Thai, Mandarin, French, Spanish, Art, Music, Drama, Design and technology, Physical Education, Geography and History.



THE WIDER CURRICULUM AND CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAMME

Our approach

We want our students to be individuals with their own unique mix of talents and interests. Not only is this important for their general wellbeing, this also allows them to access the world's best universities who now want much more than academic results. This is why we attach such importance to the students' involvement in our co-curricular programme. We have a unique mix of clubs, societies, CCAs and ECAs which involve sports, academic and creative pursuits.

CCAs

The CCA programme works alongside the curriculum lessons in order to provide an outstanding educational experience for our students. The aim is to help students balance the academic and co-curricular aspects of their lives, to allow as many students access to as many different opportunities as possible and to provide a structure that ensures all students take advantage of the programme, thereby embedding the habits and values of commitment and wider education. From Year I upwards, period 9 on a Tuesday and Thursday is taken up with these CCAs. They are compulsory for all students.



Clubs and societies

From Year I upwards, students are able to attend optional clubs and societies at lunchtime.







ECAs

ECAs provide a variety of optional events after the school day for students to choose from. These may be extensions of the CCAs or may be other activities. Many of these activities are carried out by our school staff who are passionate about sharing their interests with the students. We have also worked hard to find the best external providers to enrich our provision and have worked with dancers, sportspeople, musicians and many more to ensure that our children can follow their passions.

Sport at King's Bangkok

Sport and physical recreation are essential parts of life at our school. Experienced in a safe and supportive environment, these are vital contributors to a student's development and wellbeing. We focus on enjoyment and participation while stretching and challenging our elite sportspeople. We value sports not just for recreation and physical wellbeing. Our coaching also encourages students to build leadership, develop self-reflection and improve their teamwork.

Competition

Students have the opportunity to participate in a variety of sports including football, gymnastics, swimming and basketball among many others. There will be opportunities to represent the school in competitive matches within the house system and against other schools. On top of this, we offer an extensive co-curricular programme to give students countless opportunities to find an activity that gives them enjoyment and a sense of achievement.





Celebrating the arts

Academic excellence is a key part of our education but creativity is equally important for us. We want all of our students to gain confidence and enjoyment from the creative and performing arts in our school. This will help to develop creative and imaginative thinkers with enquiring minds. We truly believe that these skills help our students in every aspect of their life and work hand in hand with each and every aspect of school life.

Art and design

Art and Design Technology (DT) are important aspects of our curriculum as they encourage students to come up with their own solutions and experiment with different media. The development of creativity and discovering how to learn from mistakes help students develop as individuals and grow in confidence.

Music

We have 14 music practice rooms and two beautiful music classrooms as well as three performance areas for students to show off and develop their skills. We offer a wide range of musical experiences for students including choirs, ensembles and bands. Our focus is on building confidence and community through shared endeavour. As well as this, the creativity and problemsolving skills involved in composition helps students in every area of their school life. Students can also opt to take additional music lessons with peripatetic music staff.

Drama

Drama and roleplay are essential for us because they allow students to develop language and work together in front of an audience. Enriching the school life with plays in our world-class theatre and performances in our concert hall and ampitheatre are yet more ways in which we bring the school community together to celebrate the efforts of our students.

What it means to us

One of the central pillars of our school is its outstanding pastoral care. Pastoral care refers to how our school looks after every student as an individual. It is the way in which we, as a school community, work together to share information and develop a sense of wellbeing and belonging in our children, so that they look forward to coming to school each day. It also involves how we work with parents to ensure that students are getting the help and support that they need to succeed.

House system

We are very proud to be able to share the house system with King's Wimbledon. In the Pre-preparatory School students are assigned to a house just before they join Year I. They work together to gain house points which reward behaviour that models our values of good manners, kindness and wisdom.

Students also compete in house competitions which gives them both purpose and pride in shared achievements. This also allows them to build networks of friends across year groups within the framework of friendly competition.

Every house has a Head of House who also looks out for the students in their house to further support their wellbeing. The house also gives students the chance to take on responsibility and develop their leadership.

Safeguarding

We at King's Bangkok, through a carefully planned curriculum, instil in the students the skills they need to keep themselves safe in a variety of different situations that they may face, eg personal safeguarding, online security or stranger danger. We also ensure that all staff go through safer recruitment checks and have regular training on child protection.

Matthew is exceptionally excited for this new chapter in his career and he looks forward to helping implement the ethos of King's College School, Wimbledon at King's Bangkok.




Deputy Head of Pre-prep

FACILITIES

King's Bangkok has worked with teachers, parents and leading architects to ensure that we have world-class facilities. We have over 42,000 square metres of state-of-the-art school facilities which include:

- Early Years Centre designed to give students from Pre-nursery to Reception opportunities to develop, have fun and be challenged both inside and outside of the classrooms. Spacious and fully equipped classrooms of 64 square metres, large playgrounds, bicycle tracks, sandpit, cooking room, large multipurpose hall, swimming pool, and splash area.
- Bangkok and Wimbledon Academic Block for students from Year I upwards with modern and spacious (64sqm) classrooms for students, optimised for learning in the digital era.



- Four state-of-the-art science labs.
- Design Technology Studio and Robotics Lab.
- The Heart which houses Music and Art rooms.
- Library with open spaces and meeting rooms to allow students to learn independently or in a group setting.
- The Great Hall, an auditorium with 600 seats designed for studentmusic and drama productions.
- Mini Concert Hall to allow children to perform for their peers and the wider King's Bangkok community.
- Dining Hall with 600 seats.
- Aquatics Centre with an indoor Olympic-size saltwater swimming pool (50 metres) designed with natural light and shade to ensure that students have optimal water temperature all year round.

- Sports Centre with an air-conditioned sports hall housing three full-size basketball courts, an indoor jogging track and a climbing wall, which enables students to do a number of activities and sports in any weather.
- More than 2,000 square metres of shaded recreational facilities that can adapt to the needs of our students, including a fitness room, indoor futsal and other activities for student's optimal social and physical development.
- Two outdoor sports courts and two outdoor tennis courts, shaded for multipurpose use all year round.
- Additional 10,000 square metres of FIFAstandard astroturf for allround sports use.

Process and criteria


