

1.7 Bursary and Scholarship Policy

I Definitions

A bursary is an amount of money given by the school to pay for the education of a child. This is used to pay the school tuition fees and may be given as a percentage of the tuition fee cost. All bursaries are means-tested and only given to families who genuinely cannot afford to pay for the cost of education offered by King's Bangkok. All bursaries are given subject to the appropriate paperwork verifying the financial status of the family.

A scholarship is a set sum of money which is given in recognition of a genuine talent and is designed to encourage students to pursue their talents within the school. For example, it is hoped that the money given for an academic scholarship allows that student to spend money on books or courses which widen their interests and passions.

2 Bursaries

For the academic years 2020-2022, we do not offer bursaries for places at King's Bangkok. We will regularly review this policy in the future and look into ways to further improve access to our education.

3 Scholarships

The school will offer scholarships where we feel it would benefit exceptional children. It is likely that these will be fixed sums of money or a percentage reduction in tuition fees and that any scholarship given will be reviewed on a yearly basis with an unsatisfactory academic performance likely to lead to the removal of any awarded scholarship.

All policies are reviewed regularly and are subject to change.
